Synopsis

A constantly freezing man in his forties drives to a lonely petrol station every evening and orders a microwaved Toast Hawaii. Detlev indulges in this in a bizarre ritual, because it's the only thing that warms him in his daily life. But when he is observed by a stranger one night, his world begins to crumble into shameful pieces.

Director's Note

Loneliness is one of the biggest problems of our time and many people, especially men, although it's 2024, still lack the ability to open up about their inner wounds. I believe that we need more stories of understanding and overcoming the closet and the dangerous maelstrom of shame. Because together is all we have.

After first successes at local short film festivals, she studied Communication Design and Social Design in Germany, New Zealand and the United Kingdom, resulting in two Masters degrees in 2019. She then continued her studies at Filmakademie Baden-Württemberg's Animationsinstitut and graduated with a diploma in Animation/Effects Producing in 2023.

The Team

Andreas Bothe - Editor, born 1997 near Munich. Growing up as a working-class child, he developed an interest in socio-political topics at an early age. During his studies in film editing at Filmakademie Baden-Württemberg he pursued this interest by exploring various political topics in his film collaborations as an editor: Germany's political shift to the right, its male loneliness epidemic and feminist self-determination, amongst others. His films have been shown at numerous national and international film festivals and have received several awards and nominations including the Grimme Award, German Documentary Award and three nominations for the German Short Film Award.

Sebastian Ganschow - Director of Photography, Sebastian Ganschow - Director of Photography, was born and raised in Hamburg, Germany, along with three sisters. After starting out as a set runner in the film industry, he soon moved to the camera department and ultimately went to Ludwigsburg to master the ancient arts of Cinematography at the renowned Filmakademie Baden-Württemberg. He now lives in Berlin and works as Director of Photography in fiction, documentary, and - whenever he gets the chance - stop-motion.

Leoni Gora - Director of Photography, was born in Baden-Württemberg in 1996. During her Communication Design studies (B.A.), she discovered her interest in film. She deepened her passion for camera work and began her studies at Filmakademie Baden-Württemberg in 2021. She had the opportunity to study Camera for a year at La Fémis in Paris on a scholarship in 2023/2024.

Manik Möllers - Sound Supervisor, graduated in Sound Design at Filmakademie Baden-Württemberg and has shaped the sound of award-winning commercials and films. He also made a mark in gaming audio with his work on the BAFTA-awarded game Alan Wake.

Clemens Gutjahr - Musician, is an award winning film composer. He scored Academy Award-nominated animated films and worked for a feature documentary, which premiered in German cinemas. He is also involved in games and plays live as a jazz pianist.

Gregor Wittich - Lead Animator, was born andraised in Dresden. As part of their animation studies at Filmakademie Baden-Württemberg's Animationsinstitut, they worked as an Animator and Character Designer on different films, for example the Student Academy Award nominated THE UNDYING PAIN OF EXISTENCE and the Student Academy Award winning A SPARROW'S SONG. They also discovered their love for stop motion when working as Lead Animator on DETLEV. Since graduating, they worked as a set-builder and designer at Studio Soi in Ludwigsburg.

Arne Hain - Puppets, is a German Animation Director and Stop-Motion Artist known for his handcrafted, character-driven storytelling. A graduate of Filmakademie Baden-Württemberg's Animationsinstitut, Hain combines traditional and digital techniques, always tailoring the visual style to the project's tone. His diverse credits range from Phil Tippett's MAD GOD and STAR WARS: THE RISE OF SKYWALKER to commercials and award-winning shorts like THE LAST BAR.

Interview with the Director

How did you come up with this story in the first place, and what fascinated you about it?

The origin was a text message from my father. He wrote: "Don't tell Mom, but I'm sitting here at the highway rest stop and crying." Immediately, the image formed in my mind of a man sitting far out at a rest stop – alone, vulnerable, and unable to talk about his feelings. At first, I thought I was telling a story about my father, maybe about many fathers of my friends. But as the work progressed, I realized: there's a little Detlev in me as well. That made the story very personal and at the same time a universal tale about loneliness and shame.

What makes this character so interesting in your opinion?

Detlev is a perpetually cold forty-something who believes everything is fine – even though nothing really is. He clings to little rituals, like his beloved Toast Hawaii, which supposedly gives him warmth. At the same time, he avoids any form of closeness. In contrast stands Dirk, a construction worker who outwardly embodies the opposite, but inwardly carries similar abysses. And then there's Jan-Eric, the jaded teenager, who works at the gas station and doesn't understand why this man shows up every night. These three characters reflect different ways of dealing with loneliness.

Can you tell us a bit about the creative process?

It was important to me that the puppets reveal their inner selves at first glance. Detlev's face is deliberately asymmetrical – as if he were ready to run away at any moment. The world of the film was meant to feel real, ugly, warm, cold, and at the same time slightly surreal. Works like SWISS ARMY MAN, EVERYTHING EVERYWHERE ALL AT ONCE, THE SHIVERING TRUTH and Wes Anderson's FANTASTIC MR. FOX were a source of inspiration.

Please tell us about your team. How did you work together?

The core team consisted of students of Filmakademie Baden-Württemberg and its Animationsinstitut – over the course of production they became friends. You can feel their dedication in the finished film. During preproduction and set building, up to 40 people were working in parallel at times. I commuted daily between the editing room, the workshop, and puppet construction. During animation and postproduction, the team became smaller, but many team members working in core positions stayed on until the end. This collective energy is what made DETLEV possible in the first place.

How long did production take??

Three years passed from the first sketch to the internal premiere. The entire film was produced on campus in Ludwigsburg.







Interview with the Director

Which challenges did you face in the process?

After the set was completed, I spent many months almost alone in the studio. Stop-motion sets are sealed-off, dark places without daylight and without contact to the outside world. Ten months in this environment really took a toll on me. At some point, I realized that I myself had started to live like Detlev: isolated, taciturn, exhausted. That was a painful but important moment. I learned to take better care of myself and to plan future projects more collaboratively.



What does this film mean to you?

DETLEV is the first film that I directed on my own – and at the same time my largest project to date. For the first time, I feel that I've created a work I'll still be satisfied with long after its completion. That makes me very proud.

What is the core message of DETLEV?

Loneliness is one of the major issues of our time. Men in particular still struggle to talk about their inner wounds. I wanted to tell a story that shows how dangerous shame can be – and how healing connection is. Solidarity is all we have.

Can you tell us an anecdote from set?

During production we had a bitterly cold winter, and our first studio was badly insulated. We animated

wrapped in blankets at just above freezing. The shivering puppet was moved by equally shivering fingers. Luckily, after a few weeks we were able to move to a warmer studio. I'll never forget that frosty "method animation" phase.

What's next for you?

I'm currently working in Leipzig with the studio The Hidden Institute on a new short film – my post-graduation debut. At the same time, I'm writing two feature-length screenplays. My dream is to one day realise my own feature film.
